PASTORAL MESSAGE

Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

How many of us ever tried to join a club? In most clubs there are certain rules and regulations that we must follow in order to become members. We either have to give money or where certain kinds of clothes or do many other things so that we can fit in. And the sad thing is sometimes we go through all these hoops and yet we are still denied entrance into the club. The Church also demands that those who will be members fulfill certain responsibilities. My brothers and sisters in the Lord, the readings of the Sunday after the Elevation of the Cross tell us what these responsibilities are. They are faith and love. Let us take a few moments to discuss these awesome responsibilities and to see how we can fulfill them.

"Whoever desires to come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow me." (Gospel) Self-denial

This message was both to the people and to the disciples. The disciples lead people yet are part of the people of God. There are no special rules for leaders vs. those led. What should we deny? Not good things, but: sins, the predisposition towards evil and evil passions and desires. In other words, put to death the old man. Old man is separated both from God and from his fellow man. In fact he lives in death. The old man died in baptism, yet we resurrect him when we sin. We must get rid of him. This has to be voluntary since God does not force us. Instead, we are called to good things, not evil. We are called for reward not punishment. Yet man is free to choose.

What are the ramifications of this? The Christian life is not a bowl of cherries. St. John Chrysostom tells us "for although it be in my power, as Son of God, to hinder you from having any trial at all of those hardships, yet such is not my will for your sake, that you may yourself contribute something and be more approved.' God does not smooth everything over for us nor does He remove trials and tribulations from our lives. Rather, God does explain coast of discipleship which is self-denial, carrying ones cross (that is suffering), and obedience to Christ.

"If it becomes evident that we ourselves are sinners does that mean that Christ promotes sin? Absolutely not!" (St. Paul) repentance

What is repentance? Metanoia or change of mind involves real change and not simply going through motions. Why? It is because we fall short. Man is called to grow in image and likeness and to imitate God's life. C. S. Lewis in his book the Screwtape Letters tells us: He (God) really wants to fill the universe with a lot of...little replicas of himself—creatures whose life, on a miniature scale will be like...His... (He)...really wants a world of beings united to Him but still distinct. We decided to do things our way yet we need to do things God's way. When should we start? Now! After death it will be too late! We do not know the time of our death. In this life Christ grants us mercy and grace. In the next life Christ grants only judgment! Christ can forgive easily because he is Son of God, and as such has the authority to forgive sins, because he is the Son of Man, and was tempted like us.

How do we apply this to our lives? First through Prayer, which is communication with God and thus links us to Church and fellow man through God. It is a important element to Christian which makes us realize that there are others besides us. Second through fasting which restores our relationship between our body and soul and restores our relationship with God, our fellow man and nature. It makes us realize we are not most important things in universe. Thirdly receiving Holy Communion brings us into union with God and saints and indeed makes us part of Christ. It is the defining characteristic of Christian!

So we can see then that Christ calls us to follow him. To truly follow him we must deny ourselves. More accurately, we must deny the part of ourselves that was added on, that is sin. Having severed our evil dispositions we may approach the great mercy seat of Christ and be cleansed of our stains. This becomes easier knowing that Christ is indeed one of us and underwent temptation. He lived the life that he calls us to live and for that, reason can be merciful, because he knows how tough that life is. We approach the seat of mercy by using the tools that he provided us. These tools are prayer, fasting and Holy Communion. Let us then not overlook this great mercy that is given us to approach the mercy seat of Christ. For we know not the day or the hour of our death. Let us then take up our cross and follow Him. Let us not rebuild what we tore down. Let us rather persevere in the struggle so that we may join Saint Paul in saying, "It is not I who lives, but Christ who lives in me".
